

We are proud to support the Care For Veterans Charity. A simple way to give is to place your unused tokens in the collection hoxes near the exits



News of new developments and updates on the Sussex pub scene will be gratefully received by the Editor for consideration in Scratchings. The standard disclaimer on page 30 applies to all items.

ALFRISTON

The **Six Bells** has added another cask ale to its regular Harvey's Sussex Best Bitter, a recent visit found a Three Acre beer on the bar, a brewery which is proving ever more popular amongst free houses in the countryside around Eastbourne.

BARCOMBE

The **Royal Oak** recently had both Harveys Best and Sisters on handpull as well as South Down Silver lining and a Rhubarb cider.

The **Anchor** is very busy in the garden in the afternoon with holiday makers and boaters. The Harveys is still served straight from the cask and very good.

BEXHILL

The **Rose & Crown** has been reopened by Greene King as part of its Hive chain and is serving two of their regular cask ales.

The **Strand** is now serving two cask ales with Harvey's Sussex Best Bitter a regular.

BOLNEY

The Eight Bells has reopened. It's open 7 days a week, with food every day except Mondays.

BOSHAM

The **White Swan** closed in March, with rent owed.

BRACKLESHAM

The owners of the building housing **Little Monster by the Bay** are seeking planning
permission to convert to a residential property.
The bar's current lease runs until October.

BURGESS HILL

At the **Signalbox**, upcoming events include Oktoberfest (17 Sep -5 Oct) Cider Fest (15 Oct – 2 Nov) and Autumn Beer Fest (12 – 23 Nov). In addition there is pub quiz every Wednesday and

a Comedy night 2nd Monday of the month

The **Brickworks** have their end of summer party (music, beers, and cocktails) on 13 - 14 Sep and then October fest (we have 5 different German lagers) from 18th - 28th Sep. They will be holding a November beer festival (Brickfest) w/e of 28th-30th Nov.

CHAILEY

The **Five Bells** with their award-winning garden and a full food service the pub is a popular venue. They offer Harvey's Best as a regular cask ale plus two cask ales that change on a frequent basis

■ CHICHESTER

What was the **Bull** in Market Avenue has planning permission to become an "adult gaming centre". But a plan to open a café/bar in an old taxi office in the station carpark has been turned down.

The **Crate & Apple** is under new management after a short period of closure. Part of a small chain with pubs in Portsmouth & Southampton, it is food-led, its one regular cask ale being Harveys Best, with a guest from a revolving selection including Wadworth's 6X, Proper Job, London Pride and Timothy Taylor's Boltmaker.

After its latest make-over, there is no longer cask ale at the **Four Chesnuts**.

The **George & Dragon**, under the new leadership of Shelly, currently offers Langham Hip Hop, Wadworth 6X and Landlord

Ghost at the Feast in North Street has been offering keg conditioned beer in the upstairs bar. Food from downstairs can be taken upstairs to be eaten, and vice versa.

The **Vestry** in South Street now wants to be called Room 12. Although it is offering "immersive events" and "premium experiences", the drinking of cask ale is not one of them.

COCKING

The community easily raised the £30,000 it needed earlier in the year to keep the **Blue Bell**

running, so the pub is open again, but with more restricted opening hours.

CROWBOROUGH

The Cooper's Arms is holding an Indian Summer Beer and Cider Festival from Friday 26th to Sunday 28th September, midday until 10pm, featuring IPAs and golden ales as well as a selection of real ciders. This will be followed by "Hoftoberfest" on Saturday, 11th October, 5pm until 11pm. The event is sponsored by Hofmeister and beers available will include their Helles and Weissbier along with some of the best modern British lagers. Sausages and home-made sauerkraut will be available and there will be a "Masskrugstemmen" competition. This Bayarian sport involves holding a stein of beer, usually one litre, at arm's length parallel to the ground with the winner being the competitor who lasts longest. "Hoftoberfest" has become a regular event at the Cooper's over the last few years and has proved very popular with those who enjoy proper lager. Further events are planned after October and details will be found nearer the time on the pub's website at coopersarmscrow.com

CROWHUST

After rumours that the **Plough** had closed we are pleased to report this was not the case. Isabel and her partner have redecorated the pub very nicely and the Long Man Best Bitter was in very good condition. The pub is now open Wednesday to Saturday noon-10pm and Sunday noon-6pm.

EASTBOURNE

Good Beer Guide listed, **Beerarama**, in Bolton Road, has added a weekend cask ale to their usual key keg offerings.



Back in November 2024 Gun Brewery started conversations with the **Saffrons Sports Club** in Eastbourne about plans for

developing the facilities there. The site of 18 acres of trees & beautiful sports fields, all surrounded by an historic flint wall, in the very



heart of Eastbourne, now has the Gun Brewery Saffrons Tap Room. Here you will find 4 cask and 12 keg lines all serving Gun

Brewery beers. Open Monday to Friday 3-10pm and Saturday and Sunday 12.00 to close there is outdoor and indoor seating and various street food offerings are planned.

The folks behind Ascension Cider and Route 21 Beer will shortly be opening an ale and cider bar, to be called the **Wolf on the Corner**, in South Street in the town centre.

EAST GRINSTEAD

Coming up at the **Engine Room** is the popular annual Oktoberfest which runs from Friday 26th to Sunday 28th September. All days will feature German-style food and live music, as well as a selection of interesting brews. The fourth version of 'In Cahoots', brewed by Flying Trunk with hops chosen by a pub regular, proved popular as ever, and a fifth iteration is planned. As usual, please check with social media for details of music and other special events.

FAIRLIGHT



The **Cove**, in Waites Lane, continues going from strength to strength, having now become the focus of the village, holding regular quizzes and hosting



live entertainment, in addition to providing excellent meals. Two handpumps pour Harvey's Sussex Best Bitter and a guest cask ale, frequently from a local brewery. On a recent visit the Harvey's was in excellent condition.

FIVE ASH DOWN

The Pig & Butcher is a very popular family run locals pub with a good selection of Harvey's ales and food on Wednesday-Sunday.

FOREST ROW

Flying Trunk have opened a Taproom at the brewery, with their beer available on cask and keg. It's open Thursdays 3-7:30, Fridays 12-7:30 and Saturdays 12-4. There is no parking on site but it's close to the Highgate Road bus stop (Metrobus 270 and Compass Bus 261), and a short walk from the centre of the village.

HASTINGS



In Hastings Old Town, at the First In Last Out (FILO), there is a new pale session ale of their

own, 'Hop Cat' (4.0%), which will be available until they change to their winter ale late in the year. They also now have a 4.0% 'craft' pale beer called 'Crafty Cat Pale Ale.'





At the Prince Albert in Cornwallis Street. town centre, there will be another Oktoberfest this year, 24-27 September. As last

year, there will be many beers from Munich and Bavaria, and a cask ale brewed to a Munich style, last year was Anspach & Hobday 'Wunderbar.' Check social media near the time.

Across Hastings town, 3-5 October will be the Hastings Tap Takeover, when about 15 pubs and bars will have different breweries take over their beer sales, similarly, check social media nearer the time.

Then 7-15 November will see the Hastings Old Town Cider Festival with a large number of 'real' ciders available. Again not yet confirmed which pubs and bars will participate, but will be about 6 pubs and a bar or two, more news will be available nearer the time on social media.

HAYWARDS HEATH

All of the usual programme at the Hop Sun with runs, quizzes, gaming groups, with a bit of music and comedy to round it! The freshest Heathen beer, with an Only With Love tap takeover September 5th - 7th. And don't miss out on the Annual Hoptoberfest celebration September 25th - 28th, featuring beer from the UK, US, Germany, and Estonia!

HORSHAM

The **Bedford** is now being run by Jodie Munday, who also continues to run the Kings Arms.

The Malt Shovel had a full week of live music before Sam and Marie-Clare closed the doors in mid July, having rejected Stonegate's lease renewal terms. We are awaiting news of Stonegate's plans.

ICKLESHAM



The Robin Hood. a family run pub, supports the local community and beyond by providing good food and ales, both

reasonably priced. Although only two handpumps have been in use during the summer it is understood that more will be brought into use as the seasons change. In addition to recently reentering the Good Beer Guide, the pub has also been voted Branch Country pub and Regional Cider pub of the year by the members of CAMRA. It is no surprise that an extensive range of ciders, at least 21 and maybe more, are available. Cash is the preferred method of payment as a result of the high charges imposed by banks on debit and credit card use. A modest discount on the price of a pint of ale or cider is given to card carrying members of CAMRA.

LEWES

The **Brewers Arms** will be holding its annual beer festival from Fri 14 - Sun 16 Nov. There will be a quiz held on Sun 16 Nov (booking is advisable).

The **Patch**, is a café with a licence and a very good one. They open earlier and have a very good range of 10 craft beers, including Boobytrap – No milk at the dairy – Milk stout at 5.5%.

The **Royal Oak** in Station Street has Harvey's Best as well as three other changing cask ales.

The **Lewes Arms** has an array of real ales including Harvey's Best and 'Gales' HSB. There is seating in the upstairs 'garden'.

The **Gardeners** has a range of real ales and ciders. The Goldmark Vanilla Black at 5.2% was recently seen and there were beers from Salopian, Thornbridge and Lakedown available too as well as Harvey's Best.

The **John Harvey Tavern** offers an array of Harvey's ales, and the Dark Mild was recently found to be in good condition.

LINDFIELD

In September, the **Stand Up Inn** have Badge Night for LBS and their quiz at the end of the month, October sees our toads tournament. Open mic is first Tuesday of the month

NFWICK



The Royal Oak continues to offer Harvey's Best and Long Man Blonde plus a guest ale which recently was Sharp's Sea Fury. All three were

found to be in good condition on a recent visit. There is currently no food service. The pub continues to operate on a Tenancy at Will basis.

The **Crown** recently hosted the final performance by Ashdown Morris for this season. Harvey's Best was very good as usual and there is always another regularly changing cask ale on handpump.

The **Gribble** is still a ruin following the two fires earlier in the year. The owners wish to rebuild and reopen as a pub.

PETT



The Royal Oak, in Elm Lane, Pett is a friendly country pub renowned for the quality of its cask ales. Using all four handpumps means there is

always a selection to suit every taste, usually including at least one from a local brewery. Recent offerings have included Kent Cobnut and Rother Valley Golden Valley, both of which were in excellent condition. An extensive and varied menu from the pub's own kitchen includes pub classics. Additionally on Monday evenings wood fired pizzas are provided by Bell'e Buono Pizza Napoli, whilst on Tuesdays there's Thai cuisine from Asiatique. Live music events take place on Sunday afternoons. The pub holds regular quizzes and other events to support local charities and others further afield. Recently money raised from guizzes enabled a generous donation of £2500 to the Church funds and £860 to support the Army Benevolent Fund.

PETT LEVEL



Although the **New Beach Club** is a

club it offers

entry as guests to CAMRA members who visit on

an occasional basis There are five handpumps serving ales from local and regional breweries, all at attractive prices. Reflecting its LocAle status, it now showcases various brews from the Waterworks brewery in Playden. Recently Golden Flush and Pissoir have been available. the latter was tasted and found to be in fine form.

PLUMPTON

The **Fountain** is now under new management and with revised opening hours. A visit on Thursday lunchtime found Harvey's Best in excellent condition and additionally there was the option for Timothy Taylor Landlord on another handpump. The pub seems to be popular for its food offering.

The **Plough** is busy at lunchtime with many families in the garden for food as well as drinks. The Harvey's Best was excellent with additional options of Olympia or Armada.

PORTSLADE

The Stanley Arms, are planning to hold a Beer Festival on 24 - 26 Oct. Details to follow later. Check their website: thestanley.com/ nearer the time for more details. This site also lists current Beers on tap and entertainment.

RINGMER

The Cock is popular with lunchtime diners, the Harvey's Best was very good and the gardens are ideal in the current hot weather.

The **Anchor** is popular in the afternoon with Harvey's Best, Downlands Bramber and Evening Star Revival APA on the handpumps.

ST LEONARDS

There is a new landlord at the Royal Albert, Battle Road, Two real ales are usually available, Harvey's Sussex Best Bitter and a guest. Beers from Kent and Greene King have been on offer recently and were in good condition.

The **Tower** is holding its 8th Real Ale Festival from Feb 20-22nd next year. This year as part of the Hastings Tap Takeover (3-5 October 2025), beers from Fell Brewery with be on offer.

The Horse & Groom is planning to hold its first Beer Festival in the Spring. Dates to follow, and the Piper has extended its opening hours to include Thursday and Friday from 1.00pm. Cask ales are priced at £4.00 a pint until 4.00pm.

It is understood that the **Prince of Wales** in Western Road has new owners interested and that it may soon re-open.

TURNERS HILL

Phil Shoubridge has been the landlord at the Crown in Turners Hill for 28 years but he and his wife Lindsay will be taking a well-earned retirement at the end of September. When Phil took charge of this large popular pub and beer garden, which first became an inn in 1706, it was already famous for its home cured ham, egg and chips, and he has maintained its reputation for good food and beer ever since. Phil has proudly supported local beers and has had many enjoyable pub beer festivals, with beer served from a large shed at the side of the pub. The pub has frequently been in the Good Beer Guide, as the beers are always kept in top notch condition. In 2015 he even held a large beer festival at Crawley Town Hall! Recently the pub has had one hand pump free of tie and St. Austell and Tiny Rebel beers have been on recently. The pub will remain in good hands as current staff Neil and Lindsay will soon take the helm with support from Phil, and we wish him a long and happy retirement, and perhaps a chance to enjoy more time in his passion for motorcycles. The 'In Cahoots' beer series, in association with the Engine Room, has reached No.4, and No.5 is likely to appear soon. Style, strength and hops vary with each brew.

So come on over. catch a game and enjoy a pint or two in the sunshine, surrounded by glorious park-like grounds. There really is nothing quite like it anywhere in Eastbourne. In other news the Guild of Fine Foods Great Taste Awards this year saw us taking a Five-For with stars awarded for every beer entered. An amazing achievement and a testament to the hard work and attention to detail of our brewing team.

Huge news for Hand Brew Co as they are taking part in Elusive Brew's Collabageddon this November - teaming up with Thornbridge at their Bakewell brewery, and hosting Duration at their Worthing brewery. Hand have introduced a

summer special into their core range - Lobo will now be permanent. It's their Thick Juicy Tropical 5.2% New England Hazy Pale, available in keg and cans, but with every batch they produce Hand will rack off a few limited edition casks too.

Our return collaboration with Edinburgh-based Closet Brewing is a 5.5% Negroni IPA called Opie. Crystal clear, deep rich and red, with intense pithy bitterness and herbaceous aroma of juniper, pine and orange citrus. Long in the mouth with a lingering sweetness and just a kick of booze, to be enioved proudly. Beside generously sponsoring The CAMRA Worthing Beer

row they will also be exhibiting

It's been a busy few months at Harvey's. Their Old Ale was awarded Gold in the London and Southeast area Champion Beer Brown Ales, Red Ales, Old Ales, and Strong Miles category and in the Ealing Beer Festival London South East CBOB competition. Georgian Dragon was awarded was awarded top beer in the Bitters category in the SDBF in June. After the sad decision of Brighton Beir to cease brewing, and to protect their legacy, Harvev's purchased the intangible assets of the company, including their trademarks and recipes. Miles Jenner, Head Brewer and Joint Managing Director of Harvey's, explained that "While we won't be marketing Brighton Bier brands, we're planning to undertake occasional collaborative brews with them. These might pay tribute to some of their most popular beers or be something entirely new. They'll be clearly labelled as collaborations and made available for a limited time in both Brighton Bier pubs and our own. If Brighton Bier ever chooses to return to brewing. we'll be more than happy to sell the intangible assets back to them at the same price we paid."

On 12th July, Harvey's held an open day to mark the closure of the existing Harvey's Hoppers club and the launch of the new Harvey Hop Manageable Ale Trail. This runs until August 2026, is open to all to visit ten of their managed pubs. Passports are available by post of by visiting the Harvey's shop in Lewes (a passport photograph is required).

The big news is that the brewery's planning application for change of use of the Uckfield signal box to a taproom has been accepted by Wealden District Council. The application was widely supported locally, with many CAMRA members writing letters in favour. Obviously the work to convert the building to a functioning

micropub will take some time. but the aim is to get the venue open by spring 2026.

Another interesting brewery development is a new quasi wholesale arm, Sussex Beer Trader, championing Sussex (and Kent) beers by buying and selling casks and kegs from local breweries, shipping them to pubs further afield, getting beers from our region "out there." As for beers, a raft of single batch cask specials has just been released: Elderflower White (4.8%), a wheat beer. with elderflower tincture. Cask Helles (4.9%), Cascade Kveik IPA (5.5%), and Summer Stroll **IPA** (5.2%). **Ruby Porter** (4.2%) will make its return in cask from 1st September for the autumn. In addition, a new range of keg beers has just been rolled out,

including Extra Pale, Session Pale, Hayloft Lager, Cascade Kveik IPA, and Summer Stroll ΙΡΔ

Brighton Bier & Harvey's

Harvey's has taken over the intellectual property of the closed Brighton Bier brewery including its trademarks and recipes.

Brighton Bier, which closed last month citing rising costs, was established in 2012 and described itself as the city's "original craft brewers".

A website statement said: "We are sad to announce that Brighton Bier has ceased trading.

"This does not affect Brighton Bierhaus, Haus on the Hill, The Drop or West Tap.

"These are all separate businesses and will continue to trade as normal.

"Sadly market pressures with reduced margins, high costs, and increases in price of materials, combined with the current economic conditions has forced us to close the brewery."

Brighton Bier operated a 15-barrel brewery close to the city centre.

Now, Harvey's of Lewes has bought the brands to protect their future.

Harvey's head brewer and joint MD Miles Jenner said: "While we won't be marketing Brighton Bier brands, we're planning to undertake occasional collaborative brews with them.

"These might pay tribute to some of their most popular beers or be something entirely new. They'll be clearly labelled as collaborations and made available for a limited time in both Brighton Bier pubs and our own.

"If Brighton Bier ever chooses to return to brewing, we'll be more than happy to sell the intangible assets back to them at the same price we paid."

Brighton Bier director Stephen Whitehurst said: "After over a decade of brewing it was heartbreaking to have to close the brewery. It has been a pleasure to serve our wonderful customers.

"When we first started who would have known we'd be winning international awards and exporting across Europe and into Japan. That Harvey's, with their proud history and wonderful beers, saw fit to step in and protect this legacy is very humbling.

"We are very grateful to Miles and his team and look forward to exploring ways of collaborating in the future.

"Both companies are excited about this novel approach, and we hope fans of Brighton Bier will support us in keeping that creative spirit alive."

Swan, Fittleworth



The Swan, Fittleworth was a coaching inn, first recorded in the 14th century, but documented from 1536

It is found between Petworth and Pulborough near the Sussex Downs, and was on the coaching route from London to the South Coast.

In the 19th century it became popular for artists such as Turner and Constable, and others such as the composer, Edward Elgar, to stay there, finding inspiration from the surrounding countryside. Many recorded their names in visitor books, and sometimes painted the wall panels still seen in the newly restored dining room.

In 1924 it was the first venue of the Ancient Order of Froth Blowers, which whilst light hearted, became a large charity with over 500,000 members at one time.

Architecturally it was recognised for being an exceptional building, being first graded 2 by the Government back in 1955. It consisted of stables, and other outbuildings besides the inn and rooms above. It also has one of the last remaining inn signs spanning a public road.

Unfortunately, at some point, it became into the ownership of a pubco, in this instance, Enterprise Inns, and then subsequently Stonegate. It was subleased to various leaseholders, one of whom, undertook ill judged changes that would not have been sanctioned if they had been proposed in a planning application. These were not well received by visitors and the inn deteriorated despite the best efforts of subsequent leaseholders.

In 2022, Stonegate put the property up for sale, and a developer was very close to purchasing it for conversion to residential. The villagers wished to keep it open, as it's the only venue they had, and many remembered how it had been before the changes.

As it's a substantial property, and it was a huge restoration project, they couldn't raise the funds to do this but hoped for a better custodian who would be able to do this. They also alerted Arun & Adur branch of CAMRA.

Luck was on their side as a local entrepreneur, Max Skillman and his wife, decided to take on the challenge, and two of the local CAMRA branch members, met Max, his manager and chef, Angus Davies, and villager, Wade Houlden, at the inn in February 2022 so that the enormity of the task could be viewed.

Initially, progress was slow. Although Max had been able to purchase the building, negotiations with Chichester DC, South Downs National Park and Historic England to agree necessary improvements and subtle alterations to enable the building to be financially viable were torturous. It put off the start of work until 2023.

The size of the building and its upkeep, let alone repairs and refurbishment, which entailed the modernisation of the hotel rooms to be all ensuite, and a modern commercial kitchen, meant that it wouldn't be viable if an agreed planning application couldn't be approved.

Fortunately Max and his team persevered and a very impressive refurbishment was completed by November 2024. It has since been favourably reviewed in the Times, Daily Telegraph and the Metro. The two Arun & Adur CAMRA members revisited in February and found both the cask beer and food quality exceptional. Three ales on hand pump are available including a local Sussex ale.

CAMRA members met Wade Houlden there who commented that the village were delighted with the results. It has also returned to its original purpose of providing overnight accommodation for visitors. These days it will be for the public to visit the area, rather than stopping on a coach trip.
