8th CAMRA Spring Equinox Beer Festival, Horsham Drill Hall. March 18th & 19th 2022

We are delighted to announce that the 2022 CAMRA North Sussex Spring Equinox Beer & Cider Festival is due to return this March, and will again start with a Friday evening session, followed by two Saturday sessions. The venue remains the Drill Hall. Denne Road, Horsham town centre, RH12 1JF. which is about 15 to 20 minutes' walk from the railway station and less from the bus station.

The beer list will have over 50 beers, with the usual balanced mix of Winter and Spring ales, a handful of which will be served from KeyKeg. All our excellent Branch brewers will be featured, plus other local favourites and gems from further afield. If session strength stouts and porters are a favourite of yours, we will have the six current regional champions for you to try.



Sussex cider makers will again feature on Stringer's Cider bar, with a mix of traditional and flavoured ciders and perries. There will also be sparkling wine from a local vineyard on sale, along with hopefully gin from a local distillery.

We are aiming to increase the outdoor permitted drinking area this year, and are keeping everything crossed for a mild, dry weekend. We are currently planning to keep the capacity of the hall unchanged

this year, provided no additional restrictions are in place at the time.

Instead of providing a new festival glass this vear, we will re-using our stock of existing glasses. This reduction to the cost of the event has enabled us to reduce ticket prices.

Hot and cold food and snacks will be available at all sessions, with Garlic Wood Farm returning having been a big hit at the last two events.

Tickets for the Friday 6-10pm session are £5, Saturday 11:30-4.30pm session £7 and Saturday 6:30-10pm £4. Your entry fee includes a free pint for card-carrying CAMRA members, although restrictions may apply to certain beers. Please bear in mind that we again anticipate that the Saturday afternoon session will sell out several weeks in advance.

As well as being able to purchase tickets in Horsham from the Malt Shovel and the Anchor Tap, Crawley's Brewery Shades and East Grinstead's Engine Room they will also be available online at

Special restrictions may apply, opening hours may be different to those displayed here, and some pubs may be yet to re-open at all. Please use WhatPub.com for details of all Sussex pubs, and we've made every effort to ensure details on WhatPub are accurate, however we strongly advise checking ahead before visiting, by phone, website or Facebook page.

ASHURSTWOOD

The **Three Crowns** has been closed for several years and had become increasingly derelict. Recently, work has been undertaken by new owners and they hope to reopen in the Spring.

■ BEXHILL-ON-SEA

The **Brickmaker's Alehouse** will be holding a Spring Beer and Cider festival on 25th to 27th March, from 12 pm each day.



The **(RAFA) Albatross Club** has a new steward, Jodie Fisher. The beer range remains excellent.

The **Traffers Bar**, Egerton Road, always has three real ales. Harvey's Old was in excellent form during a recent visit.

BOGNOR

The **Dog and Duck**, Bognor's micropub has

moved round the corner into the High Street where the premises are larger and certainly easier to find. Triple FFF Moondance is to be the regular ale.

BRIGHTON

The **Evening Star**, Surrey Street has been stocking both the standard Dark Star Critical Mass at 7.4% ABV, and an oloroso barrel aged version at a mere 9.8% ABV.

The planning application for the conversion into residential use, for the **Free Butt**, Albion Street has been rejected.

The **Hand-in-Hand**, Upper St James's Street has announced revised opening hours of 12 noon to 9 pm, Monday – Saturday, and 12 noon to 7.30 pm on Sunday.

The **Islingword**, Queens Park Road, has been closed since 25th September 2021.

The **Montreal Arms**, Albion Hill is subject to a planning application by Stonegate. This includes replacing external signage, building an extension to the rear and the removal of the United Brewery green external tiles. Brighton & South Downs CAMRA branch members Michael Schouten and Adrian Heft have raised objections to the tile removal.

The **Royal Pavilion Tavern**, Castle Square, Brighton has applied for planning permission to alter the existing pub interior.

CROWBOROUGH

The **Cooper's Arms** has reopened following internal refurbishment and redecoration. There are plans to enlarge the bar area, probably later this year, so it is not intended to hold any beer festivals until this has been completed. At the time of writing, opening was at restricted times between Thursdays and Sundays but may be extended in light of customer demand. Certainly, when visited several times during December, the pub was very busy. In addition to the regular Harvey's Sussex Best Bitter, two



changing cask beers are usually on offer, as well as a draught cider, selected keg beers, lagers, wine and spirits. The quality of the cask beers was well up to the excellent standard for which this pub is renowned.

The **Wheatsheaf** in Jarvis Brook has fully reopened. During December Harvey's Old Ale and Sussex Best were served, both in very good condition. The food, which is great value for money and very good, is usually available at lunchtimes and on Tuesday to Thursday early evenings, although a phone call is recommended before travelling any distance.

DANEHILL

The **Coach & Horses** managed to get through the lockdowns and continues to serve Harvey's Sussex Best, plus a regularly changing guest ale. Usually this comes from another local Sussex brewer, although Larkins Traditional Bitter does occasionally appear. It's good to see that the locally produced Black Pig Cider is still available on hand pump here. It's also worth pointing out that while the pub is shown in the Good Beer Guide as being in West Sussex, it and the village are well and truly in East Sussex!

DRAGONS GREEN

The **George & Dragon** has had quite a bit of work done on it and the building has been enlarged. A new restaurant area has been added to the rear of the pub. A number of ales are served, including a house beer brewed by Hepworth's.

EASTBOURNE

Beerarama, is the name of a new establishment due to open in Bolton Road in the town centre. At the time of writing contractors were working inside. It's unclear what type of bar or shop this will be, but a licence has been granted for alcohol and music, with opening hours from 12 to 10 pm, seven day a week.

EASTERGATE

We are happy to say that nothing much has changed at the **Wilkes' Head**, except that it

iust gets better & better. As soon as he was able in April 2021, Trevor the Landlord started serving at tables in the (open-sided) marquee behind the pub, later on reopening the pub proper, and since then the range of beers on handpump has increased until it now stands at five. Langham's Hip-Hop is more or less a regular, as is Flower Pots Ale - the rest are carefully chosen from a wide range of breweries both near and far, and all are kept in perfect condition by Trevor's excellent cellarmanship. Over Christmas we were treated to a pair of gorgeous golden rarities from West Yorkshire: Osset's White Rat and Kirkstall's Three Swords - both beautiful! Local breweries featured regularly include Downlands & Bedlam. The food menu now includes a range of pizzas from an oven recently installed in the kitchen, and the large garden stands waiting for the Spring weather to return.

EAST GRINSTEAD

The **Engine Room** continues to serve a variety of beers, in both cask and keg form, from across the country. Cider is also available.

The **Open Arms** has been revamped and now has a couple of screens showing sports, but a couple of ales are available, usually from Wantsum Brewery.

The **Sportsman** is tucked away off the High Street, but continues to serve Harvey's Sussex Best on gravity, whilst the **Ship** (Young's) has three ales on offer, although St Austell Proper Job was on sale at a fiver a pint in October.

EAST WITTERING

The **Shore** now has an outside bar and an enlarged outside seating area, much of it covered, and all of it protected from the Solent winds. It continues to serve five real ales, among which are two from Palmer's of Bridport.

FAIRLIGHT

Fairlight is on the cliffs east of Hastings. Although the **Cove** was scheduled for reopening last Autumn, this had to be postponed due to problems with utility suppliers. It is now understood that opening by Easter is likely. So the village's nearly six year long and thirsty period without a pub will hopefully soon be over.

FERRING

At Rassasy Farm Shop their snug bar is doing well and has wine and cheese events as well as offering charcuterie and cheese platers to be enjoyed with the drinks. In preparation for the sun, The Snug has now extended to the outside area where the sun can be caught until late into the evening. The Snug has ales from Greyhound, Hepworth and Goldmark breweries plus Southdown spirits and Ditchling gin and vodka to enjoy, along side both local and organic wines. Being a deli, the Snug also offers a range of mixed platters and cheeseboards alongside many delicious nibbles. Throughout 2022, The Snug will be holding music, wine and cheese, Wine and Art Sunday Smoother and ale and charcuterie nights, check out their Facebook page and website for updates.

FISHBOURNE

The **Woolpack** has thankfully lost its grey exterior brickwork, and now serves beers from Bowmans.

HADLOW DOWN

The **New Inn** has resumed its original opening times. A new innovation is pub grub, offered during the early evening sessions, but other than that all remains happily unchanged. Usually Harvey's Sussex Best Bitter, IPA and a Harvey's seasonal are on offer, always in top condition. A warm welcome is assured in this unpretentious but friendly village local.

HAILSHAM



The **Crown Hotel** in the centre of the High Street has been offering everchanging guest beers, in addition to Sharpe's Doom Bar. Examples in January were from Oakham in Rutland, Ottley in Yorkshire and Three Acres near

Uckfield, making this an interesting venue to visit, especially for those looking for something different. Readers may remember that the hotel was purchased by South Coast Inns in 2020. The venue is now clean and comfortable.

HALNAKER

The **Anglesey Arms** reopened in the Autumn after a short closure for refurbishment. There are four real ale hand pumps operating; Taylors Landlord will be permanent with the other three changing, the accent being on local breweries. It remains as welcoming as ever.

HASSOCKS

Mr Duncan Lane of Hurst Brewery has applied to Mid Sussex District Council to open a micropub at 54 Keymer Road. The proposed name of the pub will be **BN6**Craft Beer & Tap. The applied for opening hours will be 11am to 5pm on Monday and Tuesday, 11am to 7pm on Wednesday, 11am to 9pm from Thursday to Saturday, and 12pm to 4pm on Sunday and Bank Holidays. The plan proposes bench seating tables, a store for casks, cans, and bottles, a micropub bar area and a retail area.

HASTINGS - Old Town

The **Albion**, George Street, sells three ales from Sussex and Kent brewers, normally Harvey's Sussex Best and a pale bitter and a darker beer; one usually from Bedlam Brewery. If visiting make sure you have a payment card with you (or other electronic device, how things change!) as they do not take cash.







The **Dolphin Inn**, Rock-aNore, with its
balcony
virtually
opposite the
Fish Market, has

altered its ale range from three regular and three guests to two and four respectively. The regulars are Harvey's Sussex Best and Dark Star Hophead. The guest ales usually include a dark beer (Winter Ale, Old, Porter or Stout), an equivalent to a Best Bitter from local breweries, and usually an American Pale Ale dry bitter, often from Kent Brewery or Oakham Ales. Live music has returned on Saturday evenings.

The **First In Last Out (FILO),** High Street, brews its own ales a short walk from the pub along Old London Road. They continue to sell five of their own beers, and one or two guest ales. Their range includes pale to darker beers, including a Porter, and served their own dark seasonal Winter Warmer during the colder months.

The **Jolly Fisherman**, East Beach Street, a cosy beer-drinking establishment, continues to sell a good range of real ales in addition to craft ones. In early January they held a Dark Beer Festival, with ten Stouts and Porters; at other times they have darker beers too.

The **Lord Nelson**, bottom of East Bourne Street, sells Courage Directors and Harvey's Sussex Best. Live music is played here on Sundays, early evening.

HAYWARDS HEATH

The **Hop Sun**, Triangle Road, the Heathen Brewers Taproom, is open on Friday 3pm until 9pm, Saturday 12 noon until 9pm, and Sunday 12 noon until 7pm (booking is advised on Friday). Alongside a number of their own beers served via air pressure from tanks, cask beers are available, both Heathen's own and guests from other small independent breweries are on sale.

Bestens Brewery have been given approval to open a micropub called **The Tap Haywards Heath** in South Road.

In the meantime, Bestens fans in Haywards Heath will have to look out for their **Shiny Beer Wagon** in the Orchards shopping area open on Saturdays and on occasional other days, see Bestens social media for details.

The **Savannah Bar**, The Broadway will install another handpump in order to sell cask beer from Heathen Brewers.

HEYSHOTT

The **Unicorn** regularly serves beers from Dragon Oak at Graffham, just up the road, alongside two other ales. On a recent visit Young's Original and Flack Manor Double Drop.

HORSHAM

The **Anchor Tap** has reopened and has three ales on hand pump, plus up to eight beers from the keg wall.

The **Dog & Bacon** is no longer a Badger pub, now owned by Red Oak Taverns. It serves Harvey's Sussex Best, plus three ales from national brewers.

The **King's Arms** in the Bishopric is now run by locals, Mike and Jodie. It usually has five ales on hand pump, mostly local, and regularly including both, Chapeau and Horsham Brewing Company from the town.

HOVE

Harvey's have a new taproom the Maris & Otter, in Western Road, which had its grand opening on the 10th December 2021, beers available included guests from Burning Sky and Unbarred alongside beers form the Harvey's range. Harvey's is supporting the Sussex Kelp project, restoring the Kelp forest along the Sussex Coastline. At the time of writing 10p from each pint of Harvey's Maris and Otter IPA goes into the fundraising pot, and there will be different type of kelp name on each of the four boutique BnB rooms at the pub which will be available to book very soon.

ICKLESHAM

The Queen's Head marked Dry January by halving the price of all soft drinks. Much more relevant for ale drinkers, all real ales were priced at £3 a pint!

PETT



The Royal Oak continues to thrive under new local management. with ales from local breweries are always on

offer. Recent offerings have included those from Kent Brewery, Lister's, Long Man, Old Dairy & Rother Valley, all in excellent condition. The current selection can be found on the Real Ale Finder app.

RYE

The Pipemakers Arms, corner of Wish Ward and Wish Street, reopened in November as a free house, having previously been tied to Greene King. Internally the pub has had a considerable refurbishment. Sue and Dave both have previous experience in the hospitality industry, with Dave having been a brewer.



Recently six real ales and three ciders were served. sourced locally and from smaller brewers further away.

ST LEONARDS-ON-SEA



The **Duke**. Duke Road, continues to offer two Gun beers in very good condition.

At the **Heist** there's usually at least one cask

beer from Three Legs available here. A

range of cuisines can be sampled, foodcourt style, in this former banking hall.

The **Nags Head** has five real ales, including some from the excellent Battle Brewery. and monthly guiz nights, etc. This guiet friendly pub is well worth a visit.

The **Royal**, is adjacent to Warrior Square



station. Check their website for up to date opening times, they

will be open longer as they get into 2022. (https://theroyalstleonards.co.uk/)

Six real ales at the **Tower** are guaranteed to impress you with range and price. There is to be a not-to-miss Beer Festival - 25-27th February.

The **Welcome** now has up to three real ales available with beers from Rother Vallev found to be in excellent condition on a recent visit

SIDLESHAM

The **Anchor** has reopened after a lengthy closure for refurbishment. It is now in the same ownership as the Beresford Hotel, Middleton, with ales mainly from the Marston group.

SOUTHWICK

The **Schooner Inn**. Albion Street, has closed pending a planning application to become a residential property and is unlikely to reopen as a pub.

UPPER HARTFIELD

The Gallipot Inn has been run by the former chef, Leo, and his wife Kerry, for just over a year now. Needless to say, the food quality is very good. Three hand pumps are in use, with Harvey's Sussex Best being the regular beer. The others are used for quest ales such as Cellar Head Session Pale and Larkin's Traditional, seasonal brews from Harvey's also feature. The 291 bus conveniently stops at the pub.

WEST DEAN

On two recent visits to the **Selsey Arms** two Langhams beers were on offer, with supplies from Gribble awaited. While the bar area remains unchanged, the barn-like restaurant has had a makeover which makes for a cosier and more welcoming feel.

WORTHING

The **Hand Brew Co tap room** is now open indoors with at least one cask ale. Keg and canned beers from Hand Brew and Cloak & Dagger. Tasting tours available via the website.

The former general stores at High Salvington is to reopen at the end of January including a small bar which will be along the lines of a micropub. No information about what drinks it will sell yet. It is in the Compass No 7 bus route but the last bus is at 18.02.

East Hoathly

The brewery is keeping four beers available and will be brewing **Sacred Solstice** 4.3% and **Saint George** in the Spring. Favourites such as **Triple Champion**, **Signature** and **Laughing Frog** are available via call and collect. Kings Head at East Hoathly - adjacent to the brewery - is open for food and the 1648 beers, all details of availability plus hours of opening are on the website.

BLO Barry Blewitt

360 DEGREES BREWINGSheffield Park

The brewery has resumed producing its full range of cask ales including the **Oatmeal Stout** 4.5%, now called **Just Right**, named in



reference to the Goldilocks tale of tasting the bears porridge. The brewery has successfully opened its taproom on site opening on Friday and Saturday afternoons & evenings with rotating choice of food truck. Only 360 Degree beers on tap and hand pump but a quality selection of canned craft in the shop which is open Monday to Saturday. They will be hosting a member's trip from the Members Weekend in April 2022.

ABYSS

Framfield

The brewery and new taproom are now fully up and running in the old Maltings building, previously part of the South Downs Brewery, in Davey's Lane, Lewes. The brewery fermentation capacity has been further increased to

204 hl (approx, 124 bbl) by the addition of four 27 hl fermentation vessels in early December. The taproom is normally open Fridays and Saturdays and this will be extended to Thursdays soon. Events are also held at other times (see @ abyssbrewing on Instagram.). The modern style beers are usually produced in rotation and are available in keg, cans and bottles while cask beer is often available in the taproom. Full details of availability, home delivery and taproom opening times are on the website.

ARUNDEL

Ford, Nr Arundel After all the turmoil of the last 12 months Arundel managed to launch 14 new beers in 2021 and install a new brew kit into their brewhouse taproom location. They also managed to get several beers scoring over 4 on Untappd which is a key objective for the brewery. The key focus in 2022 is build up to Brewfest which is planned for May 6 & 7 at the Brewhouse Project (tickets available via Eventbrite) where they will be brewing 12 collabs and generally celebrating that they survived the last two vears.

Battle

In December they launched their new improved Winter Spice Ale in 500 ml bottles. a seasonally brewed deep tawny ale offering a subtle spiciness reminiscent of dried fruits and Christmas cake. A blend of roasted malts, three British hops and plenty of festive spices make a well-rounded beer with a sweet cinnamon finish. Trade business leading up to Christmas was stunted somewhat as a result of the pandemic restrictions however the Tap Room proved very popular with seasonal events and the introduction of Skv Sports. The tap room continues to have a wide selection of cask ales and keg beers and is open 7 days a week from 11am.

BLO Mac McCutcheon BENCHMARK

Eridge Green Benchmark provided cask conditioned versions of their beers to the Spa Valley and Fastbourne Beer Festivals held at the end of 2021. These were well received and have led to enquiries for beers to be supplied outside of their local delivery area, including one enquiry from Scotland! Postal or courier delivery options are being investigated to satisfy this demand. Additionally, cask beers are now being supplied on an occasional basis to local pubs, including the Junction in Groombridge with further outlets pending.

Horsham Robin has brewed a nice cask **Porter** (4.5%), well worth trying, as part of their Project Cask, Also, a 6% Black IPA Watchman on craft Keg. Otherwise, it's Rock, Saxon Warrior and Comic Genius IPA as previous. The Porter will stay on until the end of February.

The taproom has capacity for around 60 people inside and the same outside, and also features regular street food pop-ups. They're open Thursday and Friday from 5-10pm and Saturday from 1-10pm. Expect to see an exciting new range of progressive beers being produced all of which will be available to drink at the taproom as well as the best pubs across Sussex. Favourites like

South Coast IPA and Freshman will still be available.



A PINT SIR? THAT'S 18 MINUTES PLEASE

(Article reproduced from Wightlink Winter 2021 by kind permission of editor/author Tim Marshall)

How many times have we heard, "I can remember when beer was only sixpence a pint" or similar? Only to be countered with, "Yes, but we only got paid £2 a week!"

I have been looking at a comparison between the cost of a pint and the wages at the time. And I concluded that the best way to do it was to calculate how many minutes - on average - someone would have to work to earn enough to buy a pint. All the figures have been rounded, up or down.

Researching the figures wasn't easy and I am more than willing to accept alternative numbers if a more accurate source can be found.

The results show an interesting insight into social history. The massive jump in 1930 and 1940 reflects the Great Depression (1929-39) following the Wall Street Crash. This meant the poor average worker had to toil away for the best part of an hour to earn enough to buy a pint.

Less spectacularly, the effect of inflation and decimalisation during the 1970s meant the average price of a pint went from 2/10d (14p) to 50p within a decade.

On a local note, according to the Office for National Statistics, currently the average hourly wage on the Isle of Wight is £13.36, that is, about 22p a minute. The average cost of a pint of beer is £3.80. This equates to a pint every 18 minutes – landlords please note!
